Specific forward center of gravity recommendations is found on the nameplate for extra safety. It is against the law to remove the nameplate in many jurisdictions without having permission from the forklift manufacturer. The nameplate is situated for easy reference and should always be visible. Thanks to rear-wheel steering, forklifts can work easily in tight corners. Since there is no caster action while steering a forklift, it is not necessary to apply steering force in order to deliver a constant turning state. Forklifts can become very unstable if their load is not adequately secured. The cargo and the machine need to be considered a joint unit that has a continuously varied center of gravity. It is very unsafe for the operator to turn at high speeds with a raised load. This can create a terrible tip-over situation combining centrifugal and gravitational forces. There are strict load limits within the forklift design that must be adhered to. Elevation decreases the fork load limit. An additional safety measure is the loading reference plate located on the forklift. It is not advised to use a forklift to lift personnel without incorporating specific safety gear. Forklifts are essential equipment within distribution centers and warehouses. The Drive-In/Drive-Thru Racking allows forklifts to travel inside of a storage bay for retrieving and depositing pallets. This kind of set-up relies on guide rails to help operators function within the bay. The pallet is placed on rails or cantilevered arms. This operation relies on experienced operators. Compared to other storage locations, there is a greater chance for damage since each pallet needs to enter and exit the storage facility. The buildings that rely on forklifts need to facilitate safe and efficient movement. Fork truck measurements include complete width and mast width to be carefully taken into consideration. Forklift hydraulics are essential. They either controlled with levers to manipulate hydraulic valves directly or with actuators that are electrically controlled with smaller levers. There are a variety of forklift designs, some are more ergonomic than others. Numerous design features and load capacities are available for different jobs. Most forklifts in normal warehouse settings feature load capacities between one and five tons. There are giant units with fifty tons of lift capacity used for shipping containers. Forklifts are popular on construction sites. These machines are used to carry heavy items for extended distances over rough terrain. Fork trucks unite vehicle components with lifting capacity. Forklifts are capable of unloading pallets of construction items, steel beams, bricks, tools and materials from the delivery truck and taking them where they need to be deposited. Most shipping operations rely on truck-mounted units for offloading construction items. Warehouse applications are popular for forklifts to load and unload goods. Forklift operators rely on side-shifters to tilt the mast and move loads; offering precise fork lowering and raising to maintain a stable, balanced load. Recycling operations rely on forklifts for emptying the recycling containers or trucks and taking their items to the sorting bays. These machines can load and unload tractor trailers, railway cars, elevators, straight trucks and more. Cage attachments are available for moving items that may slide off the forks such as tires. Preparing the work area is an important step prior to beginning the loading or unloading. To prevent the machine from overturning, fixed jacks are used to support the semi-trailer when it is not attached to a tractor. Be sure that the entry door's height of the vehicle clears the height of the forklift by a minimum of 5 cm. The docks should be dry and free of blockages along with the dock plates. During travel without a load, the forks need to be pointed down and kept pointed up when on the move with a load. One of the most sought after forklifts is the Counterbalance model. This model has forks at the front of the machine. It has been designed with a weight located in the back with the purpose to counter or offset the balance of the front load. This lift truck is easy to operate as it has no extended arms, enabling drivers to ride up the

racking or the load. This forklift comes in diesel, propane or electric variations. A Reach forklift is popular for warehouse applications. This kind of forklift is commonly used for interior places. The Reach can extend beyond the machine and access the racking by using its' stabilizing legs and forks, providing height that most other forklifts are unable to attain. The legs support the machine and this design makes it unnecessary to rely on weight for counterbalancing the forklift. There are Double Reach models available as well. The Double Reach lift features extended forks that are capable of reaching twice as deep as standard forks with the capacity to grasp two pallets from the same racking facility. Electric Pallet Trucks are commonly called a Walkie. These models are made so the operator walks behind the truck. These units are successful for maneuvering in small spaces and lifting heavy pallets. It is capable of transporting pallets efficiently and easily. This machine can travel backward or forward thanks to a hand throttle. This machine can stop fast and this is another benefit. There are numerous kinds of walkies, some even designed with a platform for the operator to safely stand on. Double Walkie trucks feature extended forks so the operators can handle transporting two pallets at the same time.
