

Electric Pallet Jack

Used Pallet Jacks Texas - Pallet jacks save backs by handling wood pallets with ease and moving them around warehouse locations. The unit is steered with a lever which also acts as a pump handle to raise the jack. A small handle located on the tiller allows the forks to be lowered to the ground. This handle releases hydraulic fluid when it is activated. The forks are situated on levers and there are front wheels found on the inside end of the forks. The pallet jack cylinder unites with linkage levers that are attached to the fork levers. The hydraulic jack raises at the end with this system as the links force the wheels down. Raised vertically above the front wheels, the forks only travel high enough to clear the floor to maintain safety. Usually, pallet jacks have steering wheels located at the front of the machine, while each fork is equipped with a single or double wheel design. There is a platform on some models that lets the operator stand during pallet transportation. There is a hand throttle on many models that moves the equipment forwards or backward.
